Pastor Tammy's Message

Each of the pictures in this newsletter tells a story. There is the sto- ing here. ry of Youth Night, where almost 200 junior and senior high school students came to Crossroads to be encouraged in their faith. There's the story of the Winter Carnival, where over 200 people came to support the ministry of Crossroads at Messiah Lutheran Church. There's the story of the Campus Cupboard food pantry, which gave away 1,649 pounds of food in April, and there is the story of our \$1 lunch that has grown to feed 80 or more students every week.

Pandita Ramabai, a nineteenthcentury Indian activist, said "People must not only hear about the Kingdom of God, but must see it in actual operation, on a small scale perhaps and in imperfect form, but a real demonstration nevertheless."

The pictures within this newsletter are pictures of God's kingdom on campus. The stories they tell describe what God is doing here which is, at its heart, evangelism.

Through our ministry people who would never seek the Kingdom of God encounter Christ when we welcome them, feed them, and include them in the work Christ is doing here.

Coming up in the Fall, we plan to serve another weekly meal, and to offer another worship opportunity. The Campus Cupboard will be a satellite of the Second Harvest food bank, and so we'll be able to continue to give away thousands of pounds of food to students. Thank you for supporting the ministry of Crossroads, for hoping for what we hope for, and for making our stories your own.

We served about 100 students in April! To replenish our supplies, students from Crossroads, the International Student Center and several other student clubs helped with food drives and fundraisers. It was fun to get to know each other and to work side-by-side!

The Campus Cupboard has formed several key partnerships. The local Salvation Army donates for \$1 " twice a week. left-over bread and baked goods to the Campus Cupboard bi-weekly. We asked the Laura Jane Musser Fund for \$9600 to provide a stipend for me to stav on and run Campus Cupboard next year, and to serve "Lunch We asked the Bromelkamp Foundation for \$1500 for the same purposes, and we asked the Mankato Area Foundation to help us buy a refrigerator so we can provide stulivery, a laptop and printer, and to buy food and toiletries to give away. We are asking churches if we can



leave a food bin for donations and give a 10-15 minute Power Point presentation about the Campus Cupboard and ways people can sup-port us. We are also calling grocery stores and local businesses to obtain permission to leave food donation bins with them. We currently plan to become a satellite for the Second Harvest food bank.
