Campus Cupboard

This semester Crossroads started the Campus Cupboard. We have gone about the business of feeding the hungry at Crossroads in several ways for some time both directly and indirectly. Lunch 4 \$1 has long been a way to provide a hearty and inexpensive meal for college students. Crossroads has also provided a home for the Campus Kitchen, an organization that repackages excess food from local businesses and distributes it to needy individu-

als in the community. Campus Cupboard is another way of feeding our students in Mankato. It is a food shelf specifically for college students, who merely need to bring a student ID card and they can grab a bag full of groceries. The motto for the Campus Cupboard is: Take when you need, give when you can. It speaks to the often temporary food insecurities that college students have while waiting on tui-




tion dollars or the next paycheck. Campus Cupboard fills that need in a non-judgmental atmosphere. This effort has been spearheaded by a group of Crossroads students led by Alyssa Rasmussen and Mackenzie Otterson.

They have organized the food onto shelves and are working out a plan to keep the food shelf going for the future. We got a good start on our supply of non-perishable food items when we, along with a group of international students, helped out with the scouting for food effort in Mankato. We were able to collect 908 pounds of food. However, we are always in need of donations to keep it going.

Departing President's Message

Almost a month remains before the semester finishes, and here at Crossroads we have been busy. Lunches for \$1 on Tuesdays and Worship on Wednesdays are still going strong with 44 people attending Lunch and about 25 people regularly attending worship. At Crossroads resident Amber Barnick has started a Bible study, and Erika Bauman has been organizing women's events throughout the semester, coupled with movie nights and game nights to help students take a break from studying and have some fun. Connor McVey, one of our officers on the board, has also continued his Monday night meetings for guys (ManDate). Pastor Tammy still is present in the Centennial Student Union (CSU) on Thursdays for conversation and a little knitting as well!

In March, we opened the Campus Cupboard. The Campus Cupboard is a food pantry for students at MSU whose budgets may be a little tight; this initiative was established to ensure that students do not have to miss a meal. We had a great start to the program, with the local Boy Scouts helping us to fill the food pantry with 908 lbs. of food!

Because the semester ends later in May this year, we decided instead of the Week of Work to have a Semester of Work. The biggest event was packing food at Kids Against Hunger, where though a generous monetary donation, and the assistance of several other campus organizations, we were able to package 23,338 meals for people in need overseas. On April 5-6th, we held a youth lock-in for high school students from churches around the Mankato area, with music, bowling, and much more! We will wrap up the Semester of Work on the 26th of April. After cleaning the Crossroads building, we will have an end of the semester bonfire at 7 Mile State Park.

In May, we will be doing some changeovers on the student board, and I will be stepping down from my position as Student Council President. It has been an honor to have served in this position for two years. Thank you for your support of Crossroads; because of your support we have been able to provide students opportunities to experience the love of Jesus.

It's an outreach to the LGBT community, in partnership with the LGBT Center at MSU. It's a joy to have conversations with students who are leery about the church, yet who are searching for the God who is searching for them.

Thank you, as always, for your support. Your prayers and gifts are deeply appreciated. God is very active at MSU in Mankato. We here at Crossroads are blessed to be a blessing to the campus community, for Christ's sake and on your behalf. Blessings!



Kids Against Hunger Packing



Thanks to a generous donation, Crossroads was joined by some members of the international student community, Sigma Chi, and NSSLHA in packing 23,338 meals for Kid's Against Hunger. This organization provides the materials to pack meals filled with protein, carbohydrates, and vitamins. Once packed by volunteers, the food is then shipped to the hungry at home and abroad. These nutritious meals are composed of soy, vegetables, nutrient broth, and rice and merely need boiling water to be prepared.



High School Lock-In
